New President For Women's Ski Jumping: Women's Ski Jumping USA (WSJ-USA) is pleased to welcome *Julie Hickam* as board president. *Julie* brings many years of volunteer and board service, sitting on several non-profit committees and boards in her previous community and most recently, working with the Park City Nordic Ski Club, where she was named the 2014 Volunteer of the Year and was recognized for her volunteer work by the U.S. Olympic Committee. She brings a solid business and marketing acumen with several years of experience in the title and real estate industry. On her outlook for the organization, Julie states, "I am fortunate to assume the leadership role in an organization where the inaugural team passionately set a high standard of excellence both on and off the hill. Women's Ski Jumping USA Expands Relationship with the U.S. Ski and Snowboard Association: Women's Ski Jumping USA (WSJ-USA) has announced an expanded relationship with the U.S. Ski and Snowboard Association (USSA). Beginning on October 1, 2015, USSA assumed responsibility for coaching and other operations affecting the women's ski jumping program. USSA will be taking responsibility for the national women's ski jumping program including the employment and contracting of the two national team coaches, and the partnership with Utah Olympic Park for development coach, *Lindsey Van*. WSJ-USA will focus their organizational efforts on cultivating and supporting development programs and athletes – with an emphasis on the successful Fly Girls development program.

DESCRIPTION: The Far West Western Ski Heritage program annually recognizes the best effort in the prior year that communicates the contributions of snowsports to the community at large. The purpose of the Far West Western Ski Heritage program is to raise the awareness of snowsports participants and non-participants alike of the contributions made by individuals, groups and companies to all aspects of snowsports – competitive as well as that of outdoor winter recreation and fitness. A parallel purpose is to convey the positive role snowsports has had in its contributions to the communities in the West. It recognizes outstanding effort in the area of snowsports history to find, preserve, document and share the history of snowsports in the West. DESCRIPTION: The FWSA launched the Historical Recognition Program in 2008 to develop club, league and council histories. The objective of the annual program is to capture important information about skiing from the skier's perspective and especially that of the club skier. Selection for the award is based on digital (preferable) or mailed presentation of club or council history according to a set of weighted criteria and judged by knowledgeable ski historians. FAR WEST COUNCILS

Los Angeles Council of Ski Clubs: The February LA Council meeting was held on Monday, February 1st. They were honored to have, on hand, *Tina Choi*, *National Ski Patrol of Southern* California; Sara Rosell, Operations/Outreach Coordinator for USARC, and Erin Hayden, from the Unrecables Ski Club. Each gave a talk in their particular area of expertise. Tina Choi talked about National Ski Patrol being both Nordic and Alpine patrollers, who range in age from their teens to 80+. Skiing at an Intermediate level generally is sufficient to gualify as an on-hill Patroller. The ability to ski "in control" is more important than any other ability. Required classes are offered at several Southern California locations as well as online. Perks that may be available to volunteers, which vary from hill to hill, may include passes for yourself and family/friends, discounts on food, and possibly clothing, equipment. More information can be found at: www.socalnsp.org. Sara Rosell spoke on the many ways that United States Adaptive Recreation Center (USARC) supports athletes with physical and mental disabilities. The winter Volunteer program runs December 1 through March 31, and the Summer program runs in July and August. The summer program includes water skiing, paddle boarding and kayaking. Both the winter and summer programs are held at Big Bear. USARC has approximately 150 volunteers. They become volunteers by completing a 4-day training program, and must commit to at least 6 days for the Winter program and a little less during the summer months. Volunteers ski free at Big Bear. Contact Sara at sara@usarc.com for more information. Erin Hayden, from the Unrecables, spoke on volunteering with their club, which is a chapter of Disabled Sports USA. They provide "stand-up" lessons for those visionally impaired, sliding and snowboarding. They also provide "sit-down" lessons on mono-skis and bi-skis, all done at Mammoth Mountain. The volunteers need to be intermediate level skiers, and will assist students get into their equipment, on the chair, and down the hill.
