Special features: A focus on the environment. If we don't take care of it.

Great scenery and fantastic imagery. Lots of symbolism and parallels between nature and man, such as between a human heart and arteries and the flow of traffic in and around a freeway interchange, or the flow of volcanic lava, or the veins in a leaf.

Highlights: The film starts and ends with a focus on community, laughter, showing the camaraderie between people united by a common passion for the mountains. The joy of finding a good line. Steep lines in Alaska, but also an incredible scene of backyard skiing, while crossing several neigborhood streets and dodging obstacles such as stairs, parked cars, trees, and more. Focus on earning your turns by climbing up.

Music: Good rhythms, not too loud. Use of World music, blending music from different countries into an eclectic modern mix.

Best quote: The locals say (about tree skiing): "Ski good or eat wood!"

Review of Warren Miller's "Like There's No Tomorrow"



Friday, Oct. 28, 2011.

Location: Arlene Schnitzer Concert Hall, Portland Odds of winning door prize: 1 in 2,000.

Review: Better than some recent WM movies.

Special Features: Focus on people, kids, older skiers. Time lapse and slow motion. Yeti humor.

Highlights: Filmed in lots of places, including Kashmir, New Zealand, Chile, Alaska, Utah, California. Several ski areas are named, such as Gulmarg, Portillo, Squaw, Sugarbowl, Alta, but you can barely see anything recognizeable. Most of the filming is done out of bounds, in terrain accessed only by helicopter and never seen by most skiers.

Fun stuff: Struggling at Tuckerman's Ravine, a Banzai downhill at Sugarbowl, as well as the usual: skiing impossibly steep lines.

Music: Mostly way too loud, especially the booming base. Two most memorable pieces of music: 1) A piece of World music during the Utah segment, mixing an African tune with modern rock beats. 2) A lady singing a beautiful tune, then joined by a choir (with no instruments). Suddenly you recognize the melody: Ravel's Bolero sung a capella!

Humor: A guy helps a fallen skier by casually stepping hard on his bindings to release them, and then walks away without looking back.

Best quote: "You couldn't have seen a Yeti on skis! Yetis live in the Himalayas, and besides, they are snowboarders!"

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Mt. Bachelor 4-Pack Offer



Thanks to Linda Mc-Gavin, who is currently working on the next NW Skiers' Directory, we found this deal from Mt. Bachelor offered to all NW ski clubs,. This replaces last year's "Club Card".

- 1. **For the general public:** There was only a 4-day window to purchase the 4-Pack, October 7 10.
- 2. For NWSCC club members (That's all of us!) We can still purchase the 4-pack until December 15, and it's best to do it at The Ski Fair on Nov. 7. Plus, we also get a free demo rental thrown in! Here are the details:

Mt. Bachelor is offering a new 4-Pack product for the upcoming 2011/12 winter season. The 4-Pack includes four full-day lift tickets priced at a significantly reduced rate of \$169, or \$42.25 per day, a savings of over 40% off the lead 1-day lift ticket rate of \$73. The 4-Pack provides the best value for less frequent skiers and snowboarders to access the largest resort in the Cascades during the upcoming winter season.

The 4-Pack will be valid all season long excluding the following holiday dates; 12/24/2011 - 1/1/2012, 1/14/2012 - 1/15/2012, and 2/18/2012 - 2/19/2012. Mt. Bachelor plans to operate from mid-November through 5/27/2012, conditions permitting.

The 4-Pack is non-transferable, issued to purchasers on a photo ID card similar to a season pass, and provides direct-to-lift access. A maximum of one 4-Pack purchase will be available per person with the ability to buy additional single day lift tickets, one at a time, at the lowest 1-day lift ticket rate of \$53 after the initial 4 days are utilized.

Special NWSCC benefit: Unlike the limited sale dates to the public, the 4-Pack will be available to NWSCC members in person at the NWSCC **Ski Fair November 7, 2011**, and from Oct.15 - Dec. 15 by calling Mt. Bachelor at **1-800-829-2442**. PLUS....NWSCC members can use their membership card to receive a free demo voucher when they purchase the 4-pack. The free demo will be attached to their account information. To use the voucher they will just need to (1) make a reservation, and (2) show their pass at the demo shop, and the voucher will be available in their Mt. Bachelor account.

Schweitzer Mt. discount



Schweitzer Mt., Idaho, has offered our club members a group discount, even if we purchase the tickets individually, one at a time.

On daily tickets, you'll save \$11 on each ticket. Instead of \$67, you will pay \$56.

On a 3-day pass, you save \$42. Instead of \$201, you pay only \$159. The 3 day pass is valid on any 3 days in a season. They don't have to be consecutive days.

Lift tickets and Season Passes

Note that most passes will be more expensive after November 6.

The Fusion Pass is a good deal, less expensive than a purely Timberline or Skibowl pass only. It's a nobrainer: get both Timberline and Skibowl for less than the price of just one of them!

But consider how many days you will really be skiing at the same ski area? If it's only 8 - 12 days, then a 10-time pass would be the best deal.

Spring passes are great deals, but not yet announced.

Which ski pass should I buy?

So many choices! Which ski pass is best for me? You need to decide before November 6, when most pass prices will go up. It all depends on how much you ski, how much variety you like, and what type of skier you are.

Mountain Maniac


You ski every weekend, usually both days, and you often go skiing mid-week too. In that case, there's only one other question:

- a) If you enjoy skiing the same terrain every day, get a season pass.
- b) If you like variety, consider the Fusion pass (2 ski areas), or a combination of 5 and 10-time passes. Maybe a 10-time pass to Meadows plus a 5-time Timberline pass and a 4-Pack to Mt. Bachelor. The Bachelor pass is re-chargeable.

Weekend Warrior

You ski almost every weekend, but mostly just one of the two days. There are 18 weekends from the start of December to the end of March, and chances are you will skip at least some of them, due to family obligations around the holidays, and you might skip some weekends due to bad weather. Let's assume you will ski 15 of those weekends.

Let's assume you like variety too. You might participate in the 5 PACRAT races. In December, 2 weekends might be blown on either Canada or Aspen. Even if only one weekend is involved technically, you might need the other weekend to recover. You might also join us on one or all of our 4 ski trips, which might use up between 1 and 5 weekends (the Utah trip will consume 2 of them). And how about participating in at least one of the 3 fun fundraising ski events (Oregon Cancer Ski Out, Hope on the Slopes, and/or Ski to Defeat ALS)? And how about a weekend at Mt. Bachelor or Crystal Mt.? This adds up to between 10 and 14 weekends. Out of a total of 15 weekends, this leaves you only between 1 and 5 free weekends.









Fair Weather Skier

You don't like wasting your money on a stormy day, and you are too busy to go skiing every weekend. So, you like to choose your ski days carefully. You might skip stormy December. You might ski once in January, 2 times in Februray, and 2 times in March. Get a 5 time pass if you don't mind skiing the same place every time. Or just get individual day tickets if you like variety.

BUT WAIT! THERE's MORE!

Before you decide anything, remember that most ski areas offer **Spring Passes**, which are an amazing deal! You can get 3 months of skiing (March, April, May) for only about \$100. That's when the snow is most reliable and the weather is the sunniest. What's there not to like? So, maybe you can plan on getting a Spring Pass and dropping March from the above calculations, because March will be included in the Spring Pass. This enables you to add some variety too. For example: how about a 10-time pass at one ski area and a Spring Pass at another?

Whatever you decide, have a great time on the slopes!



Squaw Valley merges with Alpine Meadows



The long-rumored merger of North Lake Tahoe's Squaw Valley USA and Alpine Meadows has finally happened. JMA Ventures, owner of Alpine Meadows, has converted its ownership into partial ownership of KSL Capital Partners of Denver, the owner of Squaw Valley USA. The deal is subject to U.S. Forest Service and California Tahoe Conservancy approval and is expected to close before the beginning of this ski season. The two areas combined will offer over 6,000 acres of ski terrain that's served by 44 lifts and which average over 800 inches of snow per season.

For now, the two ski areas will not be linked by lifts, but that is in the works for the future too. Only one ridge separates the two. For now, skiing both resorts in the same day is possible with the help of a 10 minute shuttle ride.

New Stadium Express at Mt. Hood Meadows

The old slow Stadium double chair is gone. It is replaced by a new express quad lift that will start closer to the day lodge (No need to walk uphill). The new lift wil also take you higher up, to the ridge currently occupied by the top of the Heather canyon lift. That way, it will be much easier to access the Shooting Starlift directly from the base area. Simply take the new Stadium chair up and ski down into the Shooting Star basin.

The new lift is already installed and has already been tested in October.
