this! In the Spring, when the snow is just right, it is as easy as any groomed run. And the scenery has to be seen to be believed. Be prepared to be flexible. Depending on the snow conditions, we might do different things, including:

- Skiing only groomed inbounds terrain; or
- Skiing the Alpine, Glade, or Blossom trails to Governement Camp; or
- Skiing out of bounds, dipping into Zig Zag canyon, Little Zig Zag, Sand Canyon, and White River canyon. Some of this requires leaving one or two cars in Government Camp. Bylaws changes

Voting procedure

The Mountain High Board has been working for a couple of years on preparing and polishing up some needed Bylaws changes. Once the whole Board had reviewed the changes, the text of the new Bylaws has been posted on our Web site, available for your review, since about October 2012. Several of you have already voted for approval by email just before our annual Kickoff Party in November, but the voting was not held at that time, due to some technical issues. So, we will hold the vote at the annual elections meeting on May 15.

We will hold the voting at the meeting itself. Ballots will be handed to you as you enter the building.

Proxy voting. If you cannot attend the meeting, please fill out the proxy form on the next page and put it inside an envelope. Place that inside another envelope with your name and signature on it. Mail it in. Or, if you don't care about secrecy, sign the proxy ballot and skip the extra envelope. Either way, return your vote by May 10.

Please review the new Bylaws as soon as possible, and let our President, Kurt Krueger, know if you have any comments or questions. Below is a summary of the changes.

Bylaws changes summary

Major changes.

Note that there is a version with all the changes recorded. They are a bit difficult to read since some of the sections have been rearranged. The actual changes are less than indicated.

1. Fiscal year change. We got out of phase with our tax filing and fiscal year when we got our tax exempt number. It is imperative that this change be made to avoid tax filing issues. Changing the fiscal year in the ByLaws will have no affect on how the club operates.

2. Simplification was the driving force in a lot of the changes. Minute details have been removed from the Bylaws and will be moved to Standard Operating Procedures documents. Example: Detailed duties of the officers.

3. Requirement to maintain liability insurance and for an Alcohol Policy added. Alcohol Policy required because liability insurance restricts club's role with alcohol.

Not so major changes

One of the goals was to simplify the Bylaws and to to remove day to day detailed items. The Bylaws continue to be the framework by which the club operates, but items such as detailed duties of each officer as been moved outside the Bylaws and put into a Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) document. The Bylaws still contain the major duties of the officers.
