Mt. Hood History bike ride Barlow Road - Oregon Trail

August 6, 2016 (Saturday). 19 people showed up for this adventure on the Oregon Trail (Barlow Road) from Barlow Pass to Rhododendron. We started the story of the Oregon pioneers at Barlow Pass and also visited the Pioneer Woman's grave and the Pioneer cemetery at Summit Meadows. To save some time and energy (based on previous similar bike rides), we drove our cars for the first 3 miles, from Barlow Pass to the Trillium Lake Sno Park, and then began riding our bikes from there.

At the Pioneer Cemetery, we heard the ghost of Perry Vickers, one of the tollgate keepers at Summit Meadows. Perry was buried there after being shot by a horse thief.

From Government Camp, we rode our bikes following the original wagon trail Barlow Road. Then we crossed highway 26, our last opportunity to do so before a cement median barrier is installed on highway 26, and we visited Laurel Hill, the steepest descent on the whole Oregon Trail.

We then crossed highway 26 again to get to the Pioneer Bridle Trail, and followed it through the one-horse tunnel to Kiwanis Camp Road. From there, it was an easy coasting down the hill to Rhododendron.



Mt. High annual Picnic & bike ride

August 20, 2016 (Saturday).

Only 6 people participated in the bike ride and only around 20 showed up for the picnic. Most likely people were afraid of the heat, even though the bike ride was done fairly early in the morning, when the temperatures were still in the 70s and 80s. We rode our bikes in the shade of trees much of the time and explored new paths.

The picnic started promptly at 11:30 and food was served by noon, just as predicted. We were sitting in the shade of tall trees in the park. At one point someone asked if anyone was feeling hot. Nobody felt too hot. It was pleasant. The food was good, and the company even better.

Pity that so few showed up. Maybe people are tired of the picnic. We might do something different next year.

Leif Erikson Bike Ride Mt.High AA



September 17, 2016 (Saturday). 10 am. The Leif Erickson Drive in Portland's Forest Park is a 14 mile easy bike ride consisting of one

Lift tickets and Season Passes

Here is a comparison of various lift tickets and passes. Which pass is best for you depends on how much you'll ski. Will you ski enough times at the same ski area to justify a season pass? Note that PACRAT racers will be able to get discounted lift tickets on their race days.

Remember that Meadows and Timberline will be offering Spring Passes valid for March, April and May, for about \$100 - \$130. Consider buying a 5 day or 10 day pass plus a Spring Pass, and they don't have to be at the same ski area. Also, note the following changes within the last couple of years:

1. The Fusion Pass / Powder Alliance has increased from 13 to 14 ski areas. Whitewater was added last winter (2015/2016).

2. The Mountain Collective Pass has added Ski Banff-Lake Louise and Sunshine, for a total of 14 ski areas.

3. All prices will increase in early November. Epic Pass increases Sept. 5. Mt. Bachelor prices increase after September 30.

Vail Resorts Purchases Whistler/Blackcomb

Vail Resorts Inc. has reached an agreement to buy Whistler Blackcomb Holdings, owner of Whistler Blackcomb ski resort. The C\$1.4 billion deal is expected to result in Vail's marketing machine to attract greater numbers of international visitors to Whistler Blackcomb.

"We have felt for a long time that Whistler (Blackcomb) is really the best positioned North American resort to benefit from the growth that we expect in outbound Chinese ski visitation, especially as China starts to ramp up towards the 2022 Beijing Winter Olympics," explained Vail CEO Rob Katz.

Whistler/Blackcomb will not be included in Vail's Epic Pass until the 2017/2018 winter season. This 2016/17 season, the Mountain Collective pass will still be valid at Whistler/Blackcomb.

La Niña brings snow to the NW

Everyone is predicting that La Niña will bring us colder and up to 30% snowier weather this winter.

La Niña generally pushes the jet stream farther north from the Pacific Ocean through the U.S. This increases the chance of snow across the Pacific Northwest (Oregon, Washington, and British Columbia), but it can also decrease snowfall across southern States.





red line shows the location of the longest lasting eclipse. The eclipse will last only a few seconds near the blue lines. So, the best viewing will be in places like Depoe Bay, Salem, Albany, Warm Springs and Madras.

Portland, Eugene and Bend will only see a partial eclipse, which is just a fading of the sun, not much.

Plan to come closer to Salem to see the real thing. That's when you can briefly see the sun's corona streaming outward.

The moon's shadow will race across Oregon in just 12 minutes at the speed of 3,400 miles per hour.

Solar Eclipse coming to Oregon

August 21, 2017. Get ready for an astronomical treat. A very rare event will happen in Oregon on Monday, August 21, 2017. It's a solar eclipse, when the moon gets exactly between the Earth and the Sun. The moon will block the sun's rays for about **2 minutes**. The full eclipse will start in Salem, OR at **10:18 am**. Some general effects, such as a gradual fading of the sun, will be noticeable about 30 minutes earlier.

The total eclipse will be visible only along a narrow path. The moon will cast a shadow only 87 miles wide, as shown by the blue lines on the map. The

Whitewater, BC is located about an hour north of the US/ Canada border, and just 15 minutes from the charming town of Nelson, where we will be staying.

With an an average annual snowfall of 40 feet, Whitewater has the reputation of being "one of the best powder mountain on the continent" (according to Powder Magazine). It has 2044 vertical feet, 1,200 acres, served by 3 lifts, each serving a different side of the 2 side-by side mountains. There are also 15 km of groomed trails and 10 kilometers of snowshoe trails.

Schweitzer Mt., Idaho. offers 2,900 acres and 2,400 vertical feet, served by One high-speed six-pack; two high-speed quads; one triple chairlift; three double chairlifts; 1 T-Bar. It is famous for its powder skiing. This time we will stay in the nearby town of Sandpoint, at a Best Western hotel right next to Lake Pend Oreille, and within walking distance of downtown, where you will find lots of dining options.

March 17-19, 2017 - 2 days/ 2 nights.

Maximum 50 people on the bus; inquire about driving options if bus is full, if you want to bring your family, or if you are coming from another city. The bus trips are usually our club's best and most fun events. We will leave Friday at 3 pm, and return Sunday night by 9:00 -9:30 pm. We'll visit:

1. **Mission Ridge**. 2,250' vertical. 1 Express Quad, 3 Doubles. You can ski by a World War II bomber that crashed on the mountain. Get a 15% dining discount by showing your group lift ticket.
