It's very difficult and time-consuming for Nancy to try to match up a check that has nothing attached to it, and get it in the correct slot for what it was intended.

If it is a reimbursement that you are requesting, you MUST submit a <u>check request form</u>, along with the receipt (found on our website). She has asked that any receipts be taped to the back of the Check Request.

Emilio Trampuz and **Kay Kinyon** will be working with the Forest Service on Mt. Hood to place directional safety signs west of Timberline, where skiers tend to get lost and often are doomed to spend a cold night in the forest. They will be working on marking two **safety boundaries** over the next several months and directing skiers back to the lifts (the yellow boundary) or back to Government Camp (the red boundary).

Lift Lines 193, January 2017

Mt.High A Road Trip to Small Gems in Eastern Oregon & Washington

December 29, 2016 - January 1, 2017.

Kurt Wilke and Emilio Trampuz went on a road trip to eastern Oregon and Washington to visit some hidden gems in an effort to ski all of Oregon and all of Washington. A few others were interested in this trip but couldn't make at this time of year. They might still do it later this winter. We visited the following 4 ski areas:



1. **Spout Springs**, Oregon. This area is now closed (at least temporarily) due to unsafe conditions in the parking lot which has been overwhelmed with snowmobilers, making it unsafe for skiers. Still, Emilio decided to climb the ski hill and take at least one run. We had both skied here in previous years.

The photo shows the top of the longest of 2 chairlifts. After driving most of the day from Salem, Emilio managed to climb to the top of Spout Springs just before sunset on one of the shortest days of the year.

2. Bluewood, Washington.

Great powder day here. About 4 inches of fresh snow on top of some earlier powder. It seems it's always a powder day at Bluewood!

Kurt and Emilio took turns filming each other cutting up the powder.





3. Ferguson Ridge, Oregon. What a pleasant surprise. This place offers more terrain than expected. It has a full ski patrol, an expensive grooming snow-cat, a warming hut with food, a ski shop, great snow, wonderful sunshine, relaxed atmosphere, both groomed and powder runs and tree skiing, and all this for just a \$20 lift ticket. Best deal in Oregon.

We experienced both sunshine and good powder here. It's a place where 2 inches od snow feels like 6. We'd ski here more often. Pity it's so far away.

4. **Dixie Summit,** Oregon. Also known as the **Dixie Butte Rope Tow**. The smallest ski area in Oregon, with lift tickets just \$5 per day, or a \$35 season pass. The rope tow is an advanced tow, meaning it gets steep near the top.

OK, it's not really worth driving for hours just to ski here, but you can't say you've skied all of Oregon until you've skied here too!

Pacific NW Area Clubs Recreational Alpine Teams

All team captains should have picked up the racing bibs for their teams by now. Some teams have gathered already to decorate their bibs.

Other teams will gather for the first time at our first race on Sunday, January 22, at Skibowl and the team captains will distribute the race bibs to their team-mates on the morning of the first race.

Advice for our new, first-time racers

1. **We race in dual courses**, side by side. If you like, see if you can beat the person in the course next to you. It can be fun.

2. If you are not comfortable racing next to the other racer, no problem, let him or her go ahead. You don't have to push off when the announcer says GO. Each course has a separate timing mechanism. Your time doesn't start until your legs trip the starting gate. So, feel free to let the other racer go first, and then start when you feel comfortable.

3. **Inspect the course before the race starts**. There are usually no surprises, except maybe at the very last gate. Occasionally, the last gate tricks people into thinking that they need to turn around it and some racers then end up going though their opponent's finish line instead of their own. Note that the last gate often doesn't require any turning. Instead, simply proceed straight to your finish line.

4. **Don't worry if you fall**. Only one of your two runs will count for the final results.

5. **Don't worry if you miss a race.** Only your best 4 results (out of 5 races) will count anyway.

February 12 - 18, 2017 We will stay in Salt Lake City with free shuttles to all 4 nearby ski areas: Alta, Snowbird, Brighton, and Solitude.

This is kind of a do-it-yourself group trip, with unique flexibility. We have arranged for a special **\$106 per room/per night** rate (not per person) at the Crystal Inn in downtown Salt Lake City (breakfast included). You will

contact the hotel directly with our special code and book the room directly for the dates you want - providing them with your (and your roomie's) contact info, which they will forward to Bob Burns, Trip Captain.

The "official" trip is Sunday, February 12 to Saturday, February 18th, but the code is good for +/-3 days from those dates. So, you can come in earlier, or later to hit the weekends. Stay for as little or as long as you want.

Downhill: The Ski City Super Pass is available for purchase at the hotel, from 3 to 10 days. It's good at Alta, Brighton, Snowbird or Solitude. The Pass covers transportation to and from the resorts on the UTA ski buses.

Cross-Country: The Solitude and Alta x-country areas are on the ski bus line. Fares vary from \$2.25 to \$4.50, depending on age. There are about 4 other areas, too. Special transportation from the hotel, or rental cars can be arranged, if needed.

Transportation: Chances are that most of us will fly in to Salt Lake and take the free hotel shuttle. If anyone decides to drive and needs a passenger, let Bob Burns know and he'll email blast it. Also, Bob will maintain a roommate wanted list. (Remember, the worst that happens is you have a single at \$106 per night.)

Pre-trip meeting: We'll have a pre-trip meeting in January to meet others on the trip, work out any problems and answer any questions you may have.
