Mt. Shasta & Mt. Ashland Trip

March 15 - 17, 2019. (Friday - Sunday). This weekend bus trip is a good example of how a trip can suffer



when people take too long to sign up. We needed well over 30 people to sign up in order to be able to afford hiring a bus. But only 16 people signed up in time. Since we couldn't afford the bus, we converted this to a carpooling trip. At that point, 12 people canceled. But 4 of us carpooled and had a great time, with perfectly sunny and warm weather.

Mt. Shasta had received several feet of snow just 2 weeks earlier and had to close for a couple of days to dig out the chairlifts. It was now fully open with great onditions.

At the end of the day, we enjoyed live music on a terrace just outside the day lodge, and Steven Rice even got to dance with an eager young lady! It was warm and Kay skied in just a flannel shirt and jeans!

April 5 - 7, 2019. (Friday - Sunday). There were 34 people on the trip. Linda McGavin says:



We skied with Kay and Stevie on Friday; Ron and Tom came out later; Clary and Lisa Miller skied as well and we met up at lunch.

We got pretty damp on Friday, when it was snowing at the top and raining at the bottom of Outback. We went to Outback because the east side of the mountain was quite foggy, and the wind direction was right for Outback. There was about an inch of new on top of an icy base. People who stayed on the east side complained about low visibility.

Saturday was better, with more new snow overnight (3+ inches), so we got in some powder skiing - we went over to the east side of the mountain because Pine Marten was closed for wind most of the day - as well as Outback and Northwest. It was pretty windy on top of the chairs, but visibility wasn't bad. People still ended up with wet clothing.

The party Saturday night went extremely well, with some people lingering until 9:00 enjoying each other's company. The hotel was great, and the breakfast room worked well for the party. Breakfasts were very good.

But the weather took a huge turn for the worse overnight Saturday, and that morning Bachelor's report said it was a WET winter storm with winds projected to shut down the lifts again. It was raining all over the area, meaning we couldn't even hike, so we elected to come

home a day early, forfeiting one nights' lodging and our 3rd day of lift tickets.

Some people went skiing Sunday; some didn't use their second day of lifts. Some others elected to save their lift tickets and come back another time before the end of the season.

Lisa Miller says: "Had a great time! Skied in the most intense storm ever at the top of Pine Marten just before they closed that lift. We enjoyed 1st Friday with a "Lyft" ride that looked like the cash cab, with starry lights inside. Bend brewing was very enjoyable...nice atmosphere, good beer, good company."

Diane Zhitlovsky says: "Mike and I truly had a blast. The snow was wet but plentiful. On Sunday, it snowed a ton, Mike and I skied in knee deep virgin powder on the Cloud Chaser. We were two of about ten people skiing. It was awesome. We were the wettest we've ever been."

Mt. Hood Express Expands Service



As of April 1, 2019, the Mt. Hood Express bus service between Sandy, Skibowl and Timberline has expanded by adding one more bus run around **noon**, to fill

a gap where there were no buses between 10 am and 2 pm.

The new line starts from Sandy at 11:15 am,

- stops at Skibowl at 12:02,
- stops at Collins Lake Resort, Govt.Camp at 12:10,
- arrives at Timberline at: 12:30 pm.

Then it starts its return trip at 12:45, arriving back in Sandy at 1:55 pm.

So, anyone who wants to ski down to Government Camp in the middle of the day, just make sure you get to Govy before 12:10 pm.

Mt. Spokane now has a new back side, with 7 new trails served by a new chair #6. This is in addition to the older back side, which now feels more like the side-side and is served by chair #4.

The new back side is behind the Vista House, which stands at the top of the mountain. To get to it, you need to take chair #1 to the top.

Mission Ridge Gets New Lift



Mission Ridge is replacing its chair #2, also known as The Liberator chair, with a brand new Doppelmayr high-speed, detachable quad chairlift with bubbles. The new lift will be more dependable than the old one and will better withstand bad weather and wind. It will be installed in time for the 2019/20 season.

Also new for the coming season is that Mission Ridge will operate every day of the week from December to the end of February. In March, it will switch to mostly weekends.

Plans for terrain expansion will take longer.
