Spring Passes

Spring is the best time to ski.

- * The weather gets sunnnier,
- * The crowds get thinner, and

* Spring Passes are the best deal on the mountain. For the cost of two lift tickets, you can ski for 3 months - March, April, and May.

Ski areas usually don't even mention the Spring Pass during the Winter, but they have just announced them and they are already available.

Mt. Hood Meadows Spring Pass costs \$159 for adults, \$139 for ages 65-74 and just \$99 for ages 15 - 24. Valid from March 9 to end of season.

Timberline Spring Pass costs \$149 for adults up to 70. Valid from March 2 till May 25. That's 85 days.

Skibowl's Spring Pass costs \$109. Valid till the end of this season.

If you already have a Season Pass, you don't need the Spring Pass. But the Spring Pass can be useful if you want to try a different ski area for at least a couple of days.

Website history

SNOWSPORT CLUB

History of our web site

Our club didn't have a web site until 2004. Our newsletter editor, **Emilio Trampuz**, wanted to set up one but didn't have the knowledge or the tools to do it. So, **Jack Folliard**, who was then our PACRAT President, made an announcement at one of our Pizza Parties, asking for someone to volunteer to set up a web site for the club.



Les Furnanz responded to the request. Within a month or two, we had a web site completed.

Les invited Emilio to his home and showed him the ropes, so within another month or two, Emilio took over maintaining the web site.

The original website had a similar look to today's site. Over the years, Emilio mainly changed three things:

- 1. The main menu buttons were made smaller.
- The pictures on the photos page were made larger. The first pictures were 320 pixels wide to fit two of them on a 640 pixel wide page. In 2010, the page was widened to 800 pixels, so that each photo could be 400 pixels wide. In 2016, we switched to having just one picture at a time (instead of 2 side by side), so each picture is now 800 pixels wide, same as the page.
- 3. New pages were added over the years, including: the Bulletin Board, the Awards page, the link to our Facebook page, and the 2 Forums, as well as the Ski Areas page, and most recently the "Sign Up & Pay" page.

Les' initial design didn't have a lot of pages because the general idea was that the website would simply be a reflection of the newsletter, and it would contain mainly two pages: one for **social activities** and one for **trips and ski activities**. Les had also set up our PHOTOS page.

Les's initial idea was to lessen the work involved in maintaining both the newsletter and the website. So the plan was to split the newsletter into two halves: one for the social activities and one of skiing and trips. Two separate PDF files would be created, and then they would be posted on two separate pages on the website.

Emilio, however, soon found out that the newsletter and the website work differently and that it was better to organize them and maintain them separately. So, our website gradually grew, adding new pages every once in a while. A **History** page was added to document the club's history and the history of Mt. Hood. Another page was developed to deal with **Safety** issues.

One significant addition was the **ARTICLES** page, which is a repository for articles that had been published in the newsletter but have a more permanent value. So, to make them easier to find, these articles were stored on the ARTICLES page, which should perhaps be called our RESOURCES page.

The most recently added page, added in 2018/2019, is the "**Signup & Pay**" page, which makes it possible for people to pay their membership dues, racing fees, and trip payments online, paying by credit card. Our Racing director, **Alan Bean**, was instrumental in setting up this ability, because he wanted to simplify how our PACRAT racers register and pay their racing fee.

Bill King, our club's Vice-president, developed the system of paying via Pay Pal and customized it for our club's needs.

Our current website can be roughly seen as consisting of 3 main parts:

PAST EVENTS are covered and saved on the "Newsletters page and on the PHOTOS page, where you can click on any past year to see what happened that year.

UPCOMING EVENTS are presented on our Home page (our Calendar of Events), as well as the TRIPS and RACING pages.

CURRENT AND/OR TIMELESS EVENTS are presented on pages such as our Facebook page, our 2 Forums, Articles, Awards, Blogs, Member Benefits, History and Safety pages.

The goal of the series is to provide teams and individuals the opportunity to enjoy Mt. Hood Meadows in a family friendly and recreational racing environment. Participants may race as an individual or as a team. A team consists of 4 - 6 skiers or snowboarders ages 8 and older. So get your coworkers, friends and family together

and head to the mountain!

The Town challenge is a series of three races. The first two races begin at approximately 4:30 PM and end at 7 PM. On March 24th racing begins at 10 AM and ends at 12:00 PM (noon).

Teams: Teams consist of 4-6 people with at least one person from each discipline (ski or snowboard). Teams should select one member as a team captain to represent them.
