

Ski the Glade Trail Day

March 1, 2025 (Saturday), starting at 8:00 am.



Ski from **Timberline** to **Government Camp** down the historic Glade Trail.

This is an annual event, commemorating how people used to ski on Mt. Hood before there were any ski lifts. They had to climb up from Government Camp. But now, there will be 3 shuttle buses to transport people up to Timberline. Skiing down approximately 3.5 miles of the Glade Trail can be done as many times as you wish.

This is the only day in a year that the Glade Trail - about 3 miles - is groomed and patrolled. Several ski patrollers participate in the event.

This event is a fund-raiser for the Mt. Hood Museum in Government Camp. Included in the event is a breakfast, lunch, and an apres ski party at the Museum at the end of the day. There are also door prizes. The cost is \$150 per person. More details are available on our club's website.

The number of participants is limited to 75, which is how many can fit onto the 3 shuttle buses, and it sells out every year. To reserve your spot for the Glade Trail Day, just phone the Museum at: **503-272-3301**.

Mt. High Indy Pass ski trip McCall, Idaho **Brundage Mountain & Tamarack**

3 - 5 nights. 2 - 4 ski days. Travel by car, train, or plane.

February 9 –14, 2025. -- Join us for a wonderful adventure. Up to 4 day s skiing February 9-14 (Monday-Friday) Your choice, depending upon your free lift tickets and how many days you want to ski

START DATE: Sunday, Feb. 9 – Drive to McCall & check in. You can book as many as 5 nights at our group rate. Any other nights will be at the hotel's full rate – no discount. Book as many as you want.

This is a driving trip like the past few years.

- 1. Everyone will be driving their own car. We will NOT have a bus.
- 2. For lodging, you can select your own roommate (optional), or simply have a room to yourself. Your choice. We will not assign roommates.
- 3. This trip is designed to use the **Indy Pass** (2 free days at each ski area). If you do not have a pass we suggest you buy lift tickets online in advance to get the best price. We will not have enough people to get group lift tickets.

HOTEL - Book your own room under our group rate at the Best Western Plus in McCall, 211 S. 3rd Street, McCall, ID; 208-634-2230. The hotel is located 11 miles from Brundage and 20 miles from Tamarack.

Our group rate is \$154 + tax = \$177.10 per room per night, per double gueen room or king room (guantities limited). If you have a roommate, the cost will be only half of that per person. This is less than last year.

To get this rate, just tell the hotel you are with the Mountain High club. Deadline is January 15.

The hotel offers free parking, wireless internet, non-smoking spacious rooms, a 24-hour indoor swimming pool, oversize jacuzzi tub, spa, sauna and gym. Enjoy a daily, complimentary full hot buffet breakfast which includes freshly made breakfast burritos, breakfast sandwiches, cereal, fruit, vogurt, juice, pastries (and they will deliver to your room from 6:30 to 9:30 a.m.). They have an omlette chef also on some days.

The rooms have premium bedding, High Speed Wireless Internet, Refrigerator, Microwave, DirectTV, Hairdryer, Iron/Ironing board, Desk, and Alarm Clock. Note that there is an elevator!

Please book your hotel room early – we only have a certain number of rooms. After **January 15** our room block will expire, but you can still make reservations at our rate if there is space. There is no penalty for canceling up to one week before your arrival.

NEWS: On arrival day, Feb. 9, there will be a pizza party, oreganized by the Bogus Basin Ski Club.


SKIING AT BRUNDAGE: Indy Passholders do not need to pre-schedule visits. Simply bring your valid photo ID to the on-mountain Guest Services office to redeem your ticket for the day. In addition to the two days included in the pass purchase, you may purchase a third day at 25% off. You can make that purchase the day of your visit. Like many ski areas these days, Brundage will sell tickets online in advance, at some kind of discount which is not known at this time. They've opened the online ticket buying page, so check ahead.

- The lodge does not have any pool/spa facility

Pricing: Does not include 2% hotel tax. The price below is for 2024 and includes a 10% discount applied when placing on-line reservations with priority code. Pricing will likely increase closer to year-end so reserve early for best price.

- King Room: \$134 per night
- 2 Queen Beds: \$134 per night
- 4 Queen Suite with kitchen and fireplace: \$242 per night

White Pass Group Pricing

We need to know if you have an Indy Pass, or any other qualifying pass for White Pass ski area. If we have 15+ members not having or not using their pass, then we can get a mid-week group discount.

Breakfast Restaurant – Santo Milagro

Located on the way to White Pass. Shelly will continue to work with this Restaurant while contacting other locations in Packwood and perhaps the Ski Lodge.

The owner is considering a breakfast special for our club or a free cup of coffee with breakfast purchase. This may be limited to one day.

Whitefish Mtn. Resort Trip

Ski Trips

March 23 - 28, 2025. 5 nights by car, or plane, or +2 nights on train.

Whitefish Mountain Resort offers 3000 acres of skiing on all sides of Big Mountain. It has 11 chair lifts (3 express quads). It has 2,353 vertical feet and 105 named runs plus vast amounts of bowl and tree skiing.

This will be a flexible, arrange your own transportation trip. Amtrak runs overnight from Portland or Vancouver to Whitefish and return. Current prices



start as low as \$79 per person each way reserved coach. There are a limited number of sleeper berths available. If you prefer to drive, it is a ten-hour drive, and you can stop to ski at other places along the way.

We will be staying at the **Kandahar Lodge**, a very nice onmountain hotel with a Swiss or

Austrian feel. The lobby/great room has a huge fireplace, an award-winning restaurant open only for dinner, and a small separate bar. There is no elevator. All the rooms are on the 2nd and 3rd floors.

It has a free van that will take you where you want to go on the mountain (not into town, there's a free public snow bus for that). The van only runs during the day. At night it's less than a five-minute walk to the bars and restaurants in the upper village, or to catch the snow bus into town.

You can ski-in but would have to walk 50 yards across a parking lot to ski out to a lift. Or take the free van.

For those traveling by train:

- * You will spend 2 nights on the train. The first and the last. You can sleep in the reclining seats, but it is highly recommended to ask for a sleeper car.
- * The train leaves Portland at 4:45 pm the day before and travels through the night. You need to reserve a ticket for March 22, not March 23..
- * Train arrives in Whitefish early in the morning (at 7:41 am), and you can go skiing right away, after leaving your luggage in Kandahar lodge.
- * The train leaves Whitefish late in the evening, at 8:56 pm. You can ski all day and still have time for dinner in town before boarding the train home.

Price includes:

Free European-style continental breakfast, après ski cookies, freshly made popcorn, hot chocolate, coffee, and tea. Heated boot rooms and ski rooms. Free Wi-Fi, laundry, 24-hour front desk, large outdoor jacuzzi, steam room, and fitness center. Massages are available by appointment. All rooms have at least a small refrigerator and microwave. Some rooms have small kitchens; those will be assigned on a first-come first-served basis.

Everyone arrives on Sunday, March 23, 2025 and checks out on Friday, March 28 (5 nights). We will do our best to connect people needing a roommate but the final choice of roommate is your responsibility. If you end up without a roommate, you would have to pay a single supplement (double room price less \$15).

The Club will be providing one **pizza party with beverages**.

Lodging and lift tickets will be purchased through the Club.

Spring Skiing & Spring Passes

The best kept secret among ski areas, and the best deal for skiers!

Spring skiing is the best deal on the mountain. The days get warmer and sunnier, the crowds get thinner, the lift lines get shorter. And the ungroomed snow gets as easy to ski as the groomed trails.

Nobody is even mentioning it yet, but at the beginning of March, both Timberline and Mt. Hood Meadows will offer a **Spring Pass**.

The prices have not een reveqaled yet for this season, but the usual cost is approximately equivalent to about 2 regular lift tickets, or slightly more. So, if you will be skiing at least 3 days this Spring, there is no better deal than a Spring Pass. For the cost of slighly more than 2 regular day tickets, you get unlimited skiing for almost 3 months.

Watch out for annnouncements fron both Timberline and MEadows about Spring Passes within the first week of March.

Timberline Adventures

March, April, May, 2025.

Let's ski some of the canyons west of Timberline. Or at least take a look at them and ski around them. This is a bit out of bounds, but it is well worth checking out, at least for the views. The scenery changes quite dramatically. The terrain is mostly intermediate. If the snow is good, anyone can do it. If the snow is bad - wet, heavy, or too icy - then we simply don't go there.



Emilio is offering a free, just for fun, guided tour, whenever there is anyone interested in doing it. The tour can be short, returning back to the ski lifts. Or, we can make a longer tour that would take us all the way down to Government Camp.

It is not recommend to go there in the middle of winter, when the snow is deep. But by Spring, the snow has gone through a

series of freeze and thaw cycles, and it solidifies into a firm and smooth surface that is easy to ski.


