Mt. Hood Ski Patrol facts

Consider donating to the Mt. Hood Ski Patrol to keep the patrol on the mountain. They maintain an inventory of \$75,000 in equipment, spend \$9,000-\$12,000 a year on first aid supplies, and have annual operating expenses of \$50,000.

All of their funding comes from fund raising events and donations. The patrollers volunteer their time on the mountain, as well as for required training and instruction.



Ski the Glade Day

March 6, 2004. The **Mt. Hood Cultural Center and Museum**, located across the road from Huckleberry Inn and only a few yards higher up the road, in Government Camp, organizes an annual "Ski the Glade Trail" Day, on March 6, 2004.

This is the only day when you can legally and safely ski all the way from Timberline to Government Camp. There's also food and festivities.

Meadows Lift Tickets

The price of lift tickets at Meadows has gone up from **\$44** to **\$48** on "Peak days" (all holidays & all weekends in January and February). An all day+night ticket is an additional \$5, for a total of \$53.

But, there are ways to save. All of the following tickets are valid both day and night and also on peak days:

1. Tickets are only **\$25** if you are staying at participating Hood River lodgings.

1. A **10-time pass** is only \$325, which is only **\$32.50** per day.

2. At the **Mountain Store**, on Hwy 35, near Hood River, you can buy tickets for **\$40**.

3. At **COSTCO**, you can buy a package of 3 lift tickets for \$124.99, which is **\$41.66** per day.

4. At **Ticket Master** (GI Joe's), you can get a ticket for **\$44.60**.

Remember that these tickets are still cheaper than the **\$48** peak-day weekend lift-ticket purchased at Meadows.



Affordable Lodging at Cascade Lodge

Here's one more benefit of being a club member! You can stay inexpensively at Cascade Lodge in Government Camp.

The **Cascade Lodge** is owned by the **Cascade Ski Club**, which has graciously extended an invitation to all NWSCC members, i.e. all ski club members of all ski clubs in the Northwest. We can all spend the night at the lodge, in a bunk bed, dormitory style, for only \$15. (Normally, Cascade club members pay only \$10, and their guests pay \$20.)

You can also have a good breakfast there for about \$3 - \$6.

The Cascade lodge is located right accross from Charlie's pub, at the intersection with the road to Ski Bowl East. It's just a tad downhill from Huckleberry Inn. It has its own parking lot.

No Smoking at Charlie's

Charlie's in Government Camp is now a non-smoking establishment on Fridays and Saturdays.

Chains and Traction Tires - ODOT guide

When the sign on the highway says chains or traction tires are required, it means you must either put chains on both tires of



the drive axle, or have "traction tires". But, note that "mud and snow" tires are NOT considered "traction tires". Traction tires are only studded tires or special tires displayng a mountain symbol with a snowflake.

There is an exception to this rule. You can get by without traction tires or chains if your car is a 4-wheel or all-wheel drive passenger vehicle satisfying all of the following conditions:

- a) Weighs less than 6,500 pounds or less (when unloaded);
- b) 4-whell drive is engaged (power goes to all wheels);
- c) You carry chains (just in case);

d) The car has mud & snow, all weather radial, or traction tires on all of its wheels;

e) The car is niot towing another vwehicle or trailer.

This is why 4-wheel drive cars can proceed without chaining up.
