Mt. Hood Meadows added a new chairlift this summer, named the Vista Express, for the beautiful views it will provide. It is over a mile long, has 113 chairs, and will provide 1.121' vertical rise. It will cover some underused terrain, starting near the current "Red" chair and ending up in the "Badlands", covering a mix of terrain, from beginner to ad-



vanced. Alot of the heavy lifting was done by helicopter. Total cost \$3 million.
