Pacific NW Area Clubs Recreational Alpine Teams



Mountain High, the club that skis (and rides) provides more than half of all the teams that participate in PACRAT Racing. Last year we had 13 teams of 10 people each. That's 130 racers.

PACRAT Racing is a recreational racing program on modified GS courses of 20 to 40 seconds long. We race on

five Sundays each winter at Mt. Hood ski areas. The afternoon after each race we

have a dinner and drawing for prizes donated by our sponsors. It's so much fun that there are folks who've been doing it for 20 years or more. If you're interested in trying this out this winter please check out www.mthigh.org/Racing.htm.

Each year some of our skiers also go to the Far West Ski Racing Association Championship races.

If you haven't been assigned to a team yet, contact us. Most teams end up with an opening or two, and we can always start a new team! If you want to race, contact Bruce: Yuffiet@comcast.net or: 503-697-7892.

How it Works: Details & Deadlines

1. Each racer should send to their team captain the PACRAT entry form and the Liability Release form. Both forms are available on our web site.

2. Each racer should join the club (\$25) and pay the racing fee (\$95). The payments can be sent to the club: PO Box 2182, Portland, OR 97208. Or, you can send it to your team captain. But, in either case, please make check payable to Mountain High, and please enclose and sign the **Membership signup form**.

3. By Nov. 29 (Monday, our monthly Board meeting). All team captains should send their PACRAT forms to our Racing Director, Bruce Ellison, as we need some time to cross-check all racing dues with our Treasurer. Our club will then make out one big check to PACRATs for all our racers.

4. Dec. 15 (Wednesday) -- Mandatory team captains' meeting, to pick up the racing bibs for their teams. Location: the Shanghai Noble House, in the John's Landing, 5331 SW Macadam, starting at 6:00 pm.

A look at the Infra-Rats team

So what's it like to be a PACRAT, to be part of a 10person racing team?

We started the team in 2005. Most of the team members worked at FLIR Systems Inc which makes Infrared Cameras, so of course we called ourselves Infrarats. We can

usually find about 5 racers from FLIR and the rest we recruit from the club. Colleen Hankins, our PACRAT board insider, has been with us since 2005. Many of the other racers have come and gone for various reasons. This has actually been good for the team because there's always someone new to PACRATS or returning to PACRATS that's excited to be on the team.

This year we had only 6 returning racers. **Pete Deutsch**, our Marketing Director, decided to join the team. Then I discovered that a lifetime racer and 14 year race coach named **Garth Eliason** had joined our company. It took about 5 seconds to talk Garth into joining the team. On the 15th of December I got a call from **Erin McKalip**, who wanted to do some racing after a few years away from the game. Colleen Hankins- PACRAT board member who helps everyone at the start of the race, also won the bib painting award last year.

Pete skied at Meadows as a teenager but dropped the sport during his many years in the military. He's our most enthusiastic new addition to the team, after Erin. **James Kindred**, former Bend Ski and climbing bum and current IT executive who helped his kids do racing in the 1990's but never raced himself until two years ago with Infrarats.

Scott Way- Learned to ski in Maine in the 1960's. Skied only occasionally the last 30 years until rekindling his inner skier two years ago with PACRATS. **Noel Jolivet**- Engineer and Seattle native who never raced until 2005. **Jim Rogers** loves to ski, not just race. He runs Rogers Excavating when he's not skiing. **Cindy Ellison** took up racing in 2003 as part of the Rocket Dawgs team.

So how did our season go? We had a great time. We didn't train as much as we might due to scheduling conflicts but most of us made it to 4 or more races and made it to the parties after the races. Best of all, no broken bones. We're all excited for the Rat Attack, our end of season party. Maybe we'll get a prize!

Canada Ski Safari

Mt. High Big White, Silver Star, Sun Peaks, Revelstoke, ... and more!

December 9-15, 2010 - A 5 or 6 day trip.

This might be our last Canada Ski Safari (at least for a while). We have been doing this annual trip for the past 7 years (since Dec. 2003). During this time, some of us enjoyed a total of about 20 days of free skiing at some amazing resorts in British Columbia. Unfortunately, we were not able to entice many people to join us. Two years, we had about 12 people each time, but most years it was only between 2 and 6 people.

Lift tickets used to be totally free. This year, everyone who attends the Warren Miller film show receives 2-for-1 lift tickets to 3 Canadian resorts (Big White, Silver Star, and Sun Peaks). See: <u>www.mthigh.org/index.htm#Warren Miller movie.</u>



Let's use those 2-for-1 vouchers explore several Canadian ski resorts, Big White, Silver Star, and Sun Peaks. We'll also stop at Mt. Baker and Mission Ridge (in Washington) on the way there and back.

Our usual 5 -day trip can be extended to 6 days, to include a side-trip to Revelstoke Mt. Resort, the newest ski area in North America, and the one with the biggest vertical: 5,620 feet from top to bottom!

This is a road trip, and a great adventure, skiing a different ski area each day! The exact dates depend on the snow conditions and people's preferences. We are totally free to change our minds at a moment's notice and to follow where the best snow is. There are no reservations, no deposits, ... just pure fun of our own choosing.

See how people describe a previous ski safari, at: <u>www.mthigh.org/Articles/Canada-Ski-Safari-2006.pdf</u> Note that once we are in Canada, the ski areas are all about 2 - 2.5 hours drive from each other.

Here's the plan for this year's Safari. Click here to see a map.

DAY 0: Not counting this as a real day, because people can still work this day, and drive out of Portland after work. Just drive for about 4 or 5 hours, and spend the next day skiing at either Mission Ridge or Mt. Baker.

DAY 1: Most likely: Mt. Baker or Mission Ridge or Stevens Pass. Or maybe even Apex (B.C.)

- DAY 2: Ski Big White, then 2 hrs.drive to Silver Star.
- **DAY 3:** Ski <u>Silver Star</u>. After this, anyone who wants the shorter 5-day trip can drive to Sun Peaks, while those who prefer the 6-day option can go to Revelstoke. Either way is about 2.5 hours of driving.
- **DAY 4:** Ski <u>Revelstoke Mt.</u>, a brand new ski resort, which has a total of 5,620 vertical feet, by far the largest vertical in North America. (Whistler/Blackcomb is 5,000'). Meanwhile, the shorter trip skis <u>Sun Peaks</u>.
- **DAY 5:** The longer trip skis <u>Sun Peaks</u>. Meanwhile, the shorter trip group skis <u>Mt. Baker</u>, then drives home to Portland. End of the shorter trip.
- DAY 6: The group on the longer trip skis Mt. Baker, then drives home to Portland. End of the longer trip.

This is a very informal trip. Just drive up, preferably carpool, and let's ski! If we share lodging and gas expenses, the trip can be quite affordable. In the past, we have spent anywhere between \$200 - \$350 per person for a 5 - 6 day trip. Of course, that was when ALL the lift tickets were free. Expect to spend a bit more this year. But, it will still be less expensive than most other ski trips.

No deposits or down-payments required. It's all pay as you go. No reservations are needed, or even possible, because Big White and Silver Star have a 2-night minimum requirement, but they will not turn us down if we just show up. This has never been a problem. The only thing you need for this trip is a **passport**!

January 27-30, 2011

3 days/ 3 nights. The bus trips are usually our club's best and most fun events. We will leave Thursday around 5 pm, and return Sunday night. We'll visit:

1. **The Summit at Snoqualmie.** For this trip, we are taking one extra "work" day off in order to ski Snoqualmie, which is the closest area to Seattle and gets slammed on weekends. A weekend bus trip, 2 nights/2 days. We leave Friday around 5:00 pm. Lots of fun on the bus – this is the best way to get to know other club members! We'll return Sunday by 8 pm.

Crystal Mountain is the largest ski area in Washington with 3,100 vertical

feet of skiing, with over 50 named runs. There's everything from gentle groomed cruising runs for beginners to challenging steeps - backcountry, glades, chutes and unbelievable black runs for the more adventurous. This is why SKIING Magazine voted Crystal Mountain the #7 top mountain in North America.

> There are 2 six-pack hi-speed lifts, 2 hi-speed quads, 2 triples, and 4 doubles. Also, NEW since our last trip to Crystal Mountain in 2009 is the Mt. Rainier Gondola. With travel time of less than 10 minutes (half the time of the current two chairlifts) and a vertical rise of nearly 2,500 feet, the gondola will provide year-round lift access to Crystal Mountain's summit. In addition to providing warm, dry uphill transport, the gondola also serves as backup when the Rainier Express is not able to serve the summit elevations due to high winds.

There are now 2,300 acres of lift served terrain, plus 500 acres of backcountry.

Club Council will continue. It's a free "Club Card".

1. **For the general public:** Up until the lifts open for the year Mt. Bachelor offers a "club card" picture pass for \$29 to the public that will let them buy \$50 nonholiday lift tickets.

2. For NWSCC club members (That's all of us!) - We can go to the Sports Desk at Bachelor up through January 31 and get that same card for FREE by showing our NWSCC membership card and picture ID. (Note: Your club membership card doubles as an NWSCC card. Just flip it over.)

3. **On the day we pick up the Club Card**, we can "load" it with our credit card with multiples of \$50. In the future we can load it up any time **online**, before arriving at the mountain. When we get to the mountain, we can go directly to the lifts and, as we pass through, \$50 will be deducted from our balance on the Club Card, which is a Radio Frequency ID. It's all automatic and very high tech.

Note that we can load the card in person at the Sports Desk **only the first time**. After that, we'll need to do it **online**, using a credit card.

Here's a recommendation for which pass to purchase, depending on how much you will ski at Mt. Bachelor:

- a) 2 10 days or 13 20 days: Get the Club Card.
- b) 11 12 days : Get a 12-times pass. for \$550.
- c) More than 20 times: Get a Season Pass. for \$999.
