# The Canyons West of Timberline (Mt. Hood, OR)

**April 28 - May 26, 2012.** For 5 Saturdays in a row, in April and May, several of our club members used Timberline's Spring Pass, which cost only \$110 for 3 months of skiing (March, April, and May) to explore the canyons west of Timberline, including Zig Zag canyon, Little Zig Zag canyon, Sand canyon, and the forest between Sand canyon and the Glade Trail, sometimes skiing all the way down to Government Camp. On one occasion, about 17 people showed up. More commonly, the average turnout was only about 4 or 5 people.

The area west of Timberline ski area is potentially dangerous in that it is easy to get lost in the trees and end up having to hike down for several hours toward Kiwanis Camp Road - also known as Road 39, and the same road that was the original highway to Mt. Hood, as traveled by President Roosevelt when he came to inaugurate Timberline lodge in 1937.

Emilio offered guided tours - both above and below the treeline. A few others, like Brenda and Jeff Ackerson, George Yun, Ed Palmer, had skied these canyons enough that they went on their own or guided people there.

During the past two years, Emilio has been marking two boundary lines below the tree-line, using different colored ribbons:

YELLOW ribbons show where you need to turn left and traverse back to the lifts (Stormin' Norman & Jeff Flood). RED ribbons, lower down, show where you need to turn left and traverse to get back to Government Camp.



NOTES: 1. Everything to the left (west) of the Kruser trail is out of bounds.

- 2. The blue line shows several skiable options. If you skip Little Zig Zag canyon, you can return to the Palmer lift. The next option down is to ski into Little Zig Zag and then traverse back to the bottom of the Magic Mile. A third option is to ski into the forest and follow the yellow ribbons back to the lower lifts.
- 3. Never ski more than just a few turns in Zig Zag canyon, and never go below treeline in or around Little Zig Zag.

# **Clarence "Coy" Hill** Born: April 27, 1927 Negaunee, MI Died: May 13, 2012 Ishpeming, MI

American ski jumper, inducted into the Ski Hall of Fame in 1974, passed away May 13th, at his home in Ishpeming, Michingan. He was 85.

Coy was born on April 27, 1927 and started ski jumping at the age of four and began competing at age 10. He served in the U.S. Navy during World War II and worked as an iron worker when he returned home. His love of ski jumping never diminished and he excelled in ski jumping competitions throughout the '50s and '60s.

"Ski jumping was my life," he stated during an interview in the documentary Winter Wonderland: Michigan's Golden Age of Skiing, "To fly through the air on a pair of skis..., the sensation cannot be put into words. It's the next perfect thing to flying like a bird, except the skis are your wings."

### Sarah Burke Born: September 3, 1982 Barrie, Ontario, Canada Died: January 19, 2012 Salt Lake City, Utah, USA.

Sarah Burke was a Canadian freestyle skier who was a pioneer of the superpipe event. She was a four-time Winter X Games gold medalist, and won the world championship in the halfpipe in 2005.

She successfully lobbied the International Olympic Committee (IOC) to have the event added to the Olympic program for the 2014 Winter Olympics. She was considered a medal favorite in the event. Burke died following a training accident in Park City, Utah. She was 29.

Sarah won first place in the 2001 US Freeskiing Open in the half-pipe event and finished second in slopestyle. When half-pipe made its debut at the 2005 FIS Freestyle World Ski Championships, she emerged as the first world champion. She won ESPN's 2001 Award for female skier of the year and was voted 2007's Best Female Action Sports Athlete at the ESPY awards

On January 10, 2012, Burke was seriously injured while training on the Park City Mountain Resort Eagle superpipe in Park City, Utah. Onlookers reported that Burke had completed a trick fairly well yet fell onto her head,

and the accident did not appear to be very severe. Moments later, however, she went into cardiac arrest while still on the ski slope, making her chance of survival extremely low. She was resuscitated and airlifted to the University of Utah Hospital in Salt Lake City, where she was reported to have been placed in an induced coma. The following day, she underwent neurosurgery to repair a tear in a vertebral artery. She succumbed to her injuries on January 19, 2012. According to her publicist, Burke's injuries had resulted in "irreversible damage to her brain due to lack of oxygen and blood after cardiac arrest." Her organs and tissues were donated as she requested before her death.

Because the event at which she fell was not a sanctioned competition, Burke was not covered under the insurance policy that applied to her when she competed for the Canada Freestyle Ski Association. The day after her death, Burke's agent established a website to raise \$550,000 to help pay her estimated \$200,000 hospital costs and establish "a foundation to honour Sarah's legacy and promote the ideals she valued and embodied"

# **Barlow Road Bike Ride**

Aug. 25 - 26, 2012 (Sat. - Sun.)
