Kayaking the Pend Oreille River Water Trail

August 23 - 27, 2021. (Monday - Friday) -- Report from Kurt Wilke

Thirteen of us visited northeast WA to explore the northern portion of the Pend Oreille River Water Trail. The river flows north into Canada to meet the Columbia River. This portion of the river has 2 dams, Box and Boundary. Our base camp was Edgewater State Campground near Ione, WA. We had 3 paddle days and we explored a different portion of the river each day. My guess is that we paddled 6 to 8 miles a day. We were very fortunate that the weather cooperated with us. We had sunny weather and no smoke from the wildfires. The nights were chilly and the days were very warm and no bugs to speak of too.

Day 1 we launched from the boat launch in our campground. We kayaked downstream to within a mile of Box Canyon Dam. We saw Osprey, Eagles, and turtles. Paddled back to the boat launch for lunch. Some of us then continued upstream to Ione to explore the river a bit more.



Day 2 required a shuttle as we paddled from Box Canyon Dam to Metaline. It was a pleasant float. Stopped part way to have lunch. There were bear and deer tracks on the beach we stopped at.

Day 3 we drove to Boundary dam to launch. It was a bit windy so our paddle upstream was against the wind and what little current there was. Made it easier on our way back though. 233 foot PeeWee Falls was a short paddle from our launch point. It was pretty impressive. We paddled a few more miles upstream. Interesting rock formations and checked out one of the boat only accessible campsites. On the way back to Boundary dam the water level had gone down enough where we could limbo into one of the caves with our kayaks. That was really cool.

After the paddle, some of us took a tour of the Gardner Caves, a 500 million year old limestone cavern. After the tour a couple of our group walked the quarter mile to the Canadian border. We ended the day with a pizza party at our camp.

This short description really doesn't do the trip justice. It was a wonderful trip and worth doing again.

Squaw Valley has a new name

Squaw Valley ski resort has changed its name to "Palisades Tahoe". After extensive research into the



etymology and history of the term "squaw," the company leadership decided in August 2020 that is time to drop the derogatory and offensive term "squaw" from their name. The term "squaw " has traditionally been used in a derogatory fashion, as a hag, or an ugly woman.

Across North America, numerous sites and landmarks have eliminated 'squaw' and renamed their locations. Seven states have codified that it is offensive and needs to be replaced. Many more places are in the process of doing the same. "Squaw" is listed and accepted as offensive, derogatory, racist, and misogynistic by the vast majority of modern sources and references.

The new name, Palisades Tahoe, comes from a steep zone on the mountain fulle of chutes above the Siberia chairlift. This zone has been the focus of many classic ski movies, dating back to the era of pioneering freeskiers like Scot Schmidt and Shane McConkey.

Neighboring Alpine Meadows, which is now part of the same resort, as well as the Olympic Valley at the base of Palisades Tahoe, will retain their names to distinguish the two base areas.



Manning Park joins the Indy Pass, now up to 80.

In addition to the ski areas mentioned in the previous newsletter, the Indy Pass has added 4 more ski areas. Some of them are in Iowa and Wisconsin. But the one most interesting to us in the West is **Manning Park**, British Columbia.

Manning Park was formerly known as Gibson Pass ski area, and the only sign to it on the nearby highway still says Gibson Pass. It is located east of the town of Hope. Lift tickets there are cheaper than at Sasquatch ski area (west of Hope).

Emilio skied both places 2 winters ago, as part of his ski safari through Canada. See the video of that adventure, which includes a comparison between Sasquatch and Manning Park, at: https://youtu.be/ <u>g3C6tltD--M</u>. It's a 44 minute video that covers 9 different ski areas. Sasquatch begins at 3:35, and Manning Park begins at minute: 7:00. You have to see how light the powder was at 14:24.



Mt. Hood Meadows Founder Franklin Drake **Passed Away**

Franklin Griffith Drake, who built Mt. Hood Meadows passed away peacefully on September 13, 2021 at the age of 93.

In 1966. Franklin and his brothers Donald and Mitchell entered a competitive bid with the US Forest Service for the proposed development of Mt. Hood Meadows, on the southeast face of Mt. Hood. His investment group won the award from the US Forest Service and Franklin remained CEO developing and managing the ski resort until turning it over to his son Matthew, upon his retirement in 2006.

Franklin Drake and his company built a lot of Portland landmarks, and also built the Seattle Kingdome. He built the Vista Ridge tunnels, the Moda Center, Lloyd Center, the KOIN Tower and Interstate 405. He was also president of the Multhomah Athletic Club.

But skiing was his passion, and he poured all his energy into Mt. Hood Meadows, which opened with just 2 ski lifts in 1967. The picture shows him skiing with his daughter at Mt. Hood Meadows in 1968.

Schweitzer Mountain Trip



February 13 - 16 or 17, 2021.

Monday - Tuesday - Wednesday. 2 or 3 days of skiing.

Schweitzer Mt., Idaho. offers 2,900 acres and 2,400 vertical feet, served by One high-speed six-pack; 3 high-speed quads; 2 triple chairlifts; 2 double chairlifts; 1 T-Bar. It is famous for its powder skiing.

START DATE: Sunday, Feb. 13 – Drive to Sandpoint & check in. This should be the start of the annual Schweitzer Winter Carnival (to be confirmed), so there should be all kinds of fun things to do in town!



Note that this trip (like the Mission Ridge trip last year) will be different from our usual ski trips - because of the virus pandemic:

1. Everyone will be driving their own car. We will NOT have a bus.

2. For lodging, you can select your own roommate (optional), or you simply have a room to yourself. Your choice. We will not be pairing you up with a stranger.

3. You are responsible for purchasing your own lift tickets, either day tickets or a season pass (lkon). We are looking into group rates if we have a minimum of 15 people who do not have other passes.

SKIING AT SCHWEITZER: 2 or 3 days (your choice): Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday, Feb. 14, 15, 16. Schweitzer is on an exchange program with Mt. Hood Meadows all access passholders and Loveland Ski Area passholders, who can get 3 days free skiing midweek; or you can get 4-7 days with the Ikon Pass. Those are currently the only passes we know will work at Schweitzer, and this trip is not on blackout dates.

Like many ski areas these days, Schweitzer will sell tickets online in advance, at some kind of discount which is not known at this time. They have told us that the total number of skiers should not be an issue at Schweitzer on a mid-week day; there should be no crowds.

KEEP OUR TRIP LEADER INFORMED

Everyone who signs up for this trip, please contact Linda McGavin and let her know the following:

- Did you make your hotel reservations? For how many nights 2, 3 or more?
- Will you need a lift ticket, or do you have a season pass (Meadows All Access, Loveland, or Ikon)?

Remember that you are responsible for making your own hotel reservations and obtaining your own lift tickets (or a season pass), but let Linda know your plans, as we will be able to get group rates if we have 15 people or more.

LIFT TICKETS: While Schweitzer has not published their regular winter season ticket rates as of late September, they have told us the group prices for 15-19 people:

Adult: \$81.00 plus taxes/fees = \$88.87 (age 18–64) or College/Senior/Military: \$77.00 plus taxes/fees = \$84.48.

If we do this you will have to pay Linda for your lift tickets that she arranges, as only one person can pay for those tickets. We won't know whether we can do this until we know how many signups we have for the trip, so don't delay in signing up! (We will also check to make sure that it isn't cheaper to just buy your tickets online.)

HOTEL: Book your own room at the Hotel Ruby Sandpoint/Ponderay in Sandpoint, 477255 US-95, Ponderay, ID 83852; 208-263-5383. Book early to get rooms at the best rate.

This is one of the closest hotels to the ski area, located just 11 miles or 22 minutes away. The hotel is only 2 miles from the parking lot where Schweitzer runs a free shuttle bus between 7 am and 5:30 pm, every half hour. https://www.schweitzer.com/plan/shuttle-and-parking/

Parking on the mountain may cost big bucks if you want to park in the premium parking, which is the closest. There is a secondary parking lot near the bottom of the Musical Chairs lift which serves beginner terrain. The only issue with that is that the Musical Chairs is a slow double chairlift.

The hotel offers free parking, wireless internet, premium bedding, non-smoking rooms, an indoor swimming pool and two hot tubs, and a ski room. Enjoy a daily, complimentary breakfast which includes waffles, cereal, mini bagels, English muffins, blueberry muffins, hard boiled eggs, oatmeal, orange juice, milk, coffee, apples, and oranges. The rooms have premium bedding, Wireless Internet, Mini Fridge, Microwave, Cable/Satellite TV, DVD Player, Free Toiletries, Hairdryer, Iron/Ironing board, Desk, and Alarm Clock. Note that there are no elevators – if you need a ground floor room please be sure to ask for it.

Ski Trips

Please book your hotel room early - there is no penalty for canceling up to 4:00 pm the night before your arrival.

Good news: Group Rate – The hotel has set up a special rate for our members who book rooms for ANY TIME between October 16 and March 31! You will book directly through the website, <u>hotelrubysandpoint.com</u> using the promo code SKI2022.

NOTE: You need to enter the promo code SKI2022 before you pick a room so the rate will be applied.

For our dates, after the discount the rooms at the Hotel Ruby should have either:

- one single queen bed for \$84/night + tax = \$96.60; or
- two queen beds for \$92/night + tax = \$105.80.

NOTE: The club is not collecting any money for this trip. We will pay the hotel individually and buy lift tickets individually. And for transportation, we;ll drive our own cars.

Getting to Schweitzer

Your own car is the best transportation for this trip.

The AMTRAK Empire Builder train leaves Portland at 4:45 pm and arrives in Sandpoint at 2:30 am, a very inconvenient time. You'll need a taxi to travel the 3 miles from the train station to the Ruby hotel, and another 2 miles the next day from the hotel to the Schweitzer shuttle station.

Another option is to fly to Spokane and rent a car there.

But having your own car is probably the best.

March 13 - 20, 2022. 4, 5, or 7 nights - by train, car, or plane.

Whitefish Mountain Resort offers 3000 acres of skiing on all sides of Big Mountain. It has 11 chair lifts (3 express quads). It has 2,353 vertical feet and 105 named runs plus vast amounts of bowl and tree skiing.

This will be a flexible, arrange your own transportation trip. Amtrak runs overnight from Portland or Vancouver to Whitefish and return. Current prices



start as low as \$79 per person each way reserved coach. There are a limited number of sleeper berths available. If you prefer to drive, it is a ten-hour drive, and you can stop to ski at other places along the way.

We will be staying at the **Kandahar Lodge**, a very nice onmountain hotel with a Swiss or

Austrian feel. The lobby/great room has a huge fireplace, an award-winning restaurant open only for dinner, and a small separate bar. There is no elevator. All the rooms are on the 2nd and 3rd floors.

It has a free van that will take you where you want to go on the mountain (not into town, there's a free public snow bus for that). The van only runs during the day. At night it's less than a five-minute walk to the bars and restaurants in the upper village, or to catch the snow bus into town.

You can ski-in but would have to walk 50 yards across a parking lot to ski out to a lift. Or take the free van.

For those traveling by train:

- * You will spend 2 nights on the train. The first and the last. You can sleep in the reclining seats, but it is highly recommended to ask for a sleeper car.
- * The train leaves Portland at 4:45 pm the day before and travels through the night. You need to reserve a ticket for March 12.
- * Train arrives in Whitefish early in the morning (at 7:41 am), and you can go skiing right away, after leaving your luggage in Kandahar lodge.
- * The train leaves Whitefish late in the evening, at 8:56 pm. You can ski all day and still have time for dinner in town before boarding the train home.

Price includes:

Free European-style continental breakfast, après ski cookies, freshly made popcorn, hot chocolate, coffee, and tea. Heated boot rooms and ski rooms. Free Wi-Fi, laundry, 24-hour front desk, large outdoor jacuzzi, steam room, and fitness center. Massages are available by appointment. All rooms have at least a small refrigerator and microwave. Some rooms have small kitchens; those will be assigned on a first-come first-served basis.

We have reserved all rooms for 7 nights from March 13 - 20, 2022, but we will also be able to offer either 4- or 5-night stays.

Because we will receive the 7th night comped, 6-night pricing will be the same as 7-night. To make things manageable & simplify matching of roommates, All 4-night and 5-night stays must begin on March 13.

We will do our best to match you with a roommate who wants the same nights as you, but you are ultimately responsible for finding a roommate who wants the same nights as you to fill your room.

Pricing

Lodging (2 people per room) \$420/person for 6 or 7 nights (we get the 7th night free) \$350 for 5 nights \$280 for 4 nights.

For fewer than 6 nights, everyone in the room would need to have the same arrival and departure dates.

All lodging starts **Sunday, March 13.**

Season Passes Comparison

Season Pass Use the Comparison Chart we have compiled to figure out which pass is best for you. It depends on where you plan to ski.

It's a challenge to put this chart together because prices change the longer you wait, while many ski areas will not reveal their prices until late in the Fall.

Some prices have already gone up, such as the IKON pass. Most prices will go up in November, after November 7.

The Comparison Chart is published on our website, on the ARTICLES page, where we keep some articles of more permanent value. See this chart at: <u>http://www.mthigh.org/Articles/Season-Passes-Comparsion.pdf</u>

Note that the long list of ski areas in the comparison chart is updated each year, and new ski areas get added. The number of ski areas in some cases has grown larger than what will fit in the limited amount of space. So, for the most accurate and up-to-date list, check the corresponding website.

A ski area may be included in more than one pass. If you know which ski areas you might visit next season, do a search for those in the chart. On a computer, click the **Ctrl+F** keys (or **Cmd+F** on Apple computers). On a smartphone or tablet, chose the option to "Search on page".

General Info

RENEWING A PASS. In some cases, you can get a better price if you already had a certain pass the previous winter and are now just renewing it. Examples: Mt. Hood Meadows, IKON Pass, etc.

NIGHT SKIING. Note that in addition to the regular season passes, Mt. Hood Skibowl also offers a Night Skiing season pass for just \$229.

SPRING PASSES. Note that **Meadows**, **Timberline**, and **Skibowl** will be offering **Spring Passes** valid for almost 3 months of skiing in March, April and May, for about \$139 - \$160. Information about these passes will not be available until some time late in February.

VARIETY. For maximum variety, consider the possibility of combining several different passes, such as:

• Buy a season pass to one ski area, and then at the beginning of March, buy a Spring Pass to one of the others.

Some Specifics

IKON PASS. Mt. Bachelor is now part of the IKON Pass. Lower prices offered before June 17 and will be higher after that. This pass is centered around Aspen/Snowmass and all the ski areas owned by or related to them.

EPIC PASS. This pass is centered around Vail Resorts and all the ski areas owned by them. Note that there is an option to purchase an Epic Lake Tahoe pass that includes just Heavenly, Northstar, and Kirkwood.

INDY PASS. The Independent ski areas pass has grown to 68 ski areas. You get 2 free days at each. The latest additions among western ski areas are: Powder Mt. (Utah), Eagle Point (UT) and Mt. Ashland (Oregon). If you already have a season pass to any Indy ski area, you can save about \$90 by purchasing the Add-on Indy pass instead of the full pass.

POWDER ALLIANCE. The Powder Alliance is somewhat similar to the Indy Pass in that it also includes mainly independently owned ski areas, but it also includes unlimited skiing at your home mountain. For Oregonians, that means unlimited skiing at Timberline and Skibowl (with the Fusion Pass) plus 3 days at each of the other 17 ski areas. Note that there is no pass called the Powder Alliance Pass. Instead, your local season pass (the Fusion Pass) is simply valid at all the other Powder Alliance ski areas.

LOVELAND PASS with POWDER ALLIANCE. This pass gives you 3 free days at all the Powder Alliance ski areas **plus** another 18 ski areas on top of that! This includes Powder Mt. (UT), Whitefish (MT), Schweitzer Mt. (ID), Purgatory (CO), Homewood (CA), and more. But you get only 3 days at Timberline and 3 at Skibowl.
