How To Connect With Us Digitally



Newcomers to the club, please join us on the slopes. It's best to first connect with us through the club's **Forums** and our **Facebook page**. Links to all of these are available in the main menu on our website: www.mthigh.org

The way it works is that whenever anyone posts something in one of our Forums (which are actually Google Groups), everyone who has joined the Forum will receive an email. Usually, only the initial posting is done directly in the Forum, and after that, you simply reply to the whole Group via email. But, one can also make even the initial posting by sending an email to one of these two addresses:

But first, make sure to **Join the Group** by clicking on "Join this Group" in the upper right corner of the Forum screen. Provide an email address, so the Forum will notify you when something new is posted. Select to receive all Forum emails if you want to be able to participate in a "conversation". There is not a lot of "chatter".

Alpine Trail is now Groomed from Timberline to Summit Pass

Timberline now owns the Summit ski area, which has been renamed to "Summit Pass". In an effort to connect the two, the Alpine Trail is now a groomed trail and there are free shuttles to take you back to Timberline.

The groomed Alpine trail is a disappointment. It is way too narrow and descends in a straight line even on the steepest part of it. So, instead of having fun skiing, you have to focus on checking your speed by making very quick short turns, constantly braking, and constantly in danger of hitting the wall of snow on the sides of the groomed trail. This is more work than fun. The trail should be widened, or at least let it zig zag across the steepest part of the trail. If that is not possible, it is better to leave it ungroomed.

Also, the trail is now full of Nordic skiers using it to climb up, even though they have a separate trail nearby.

West Leg Road from Timberline to Summit Pass

West Leg Road is surprisingly a much better alternative to the groomed Alpine Trail. It is 2 or 3 times wider, with a nice pitch that seems just right. There is no need to brake all the time; just control you speed a bit.

The main problem is that most people don't know where the trail leaves Timberline. So, there is nobody on it. But the few who have skied it (like Emilio Trampuz, John Yoo, Kurt Wilke, and Clary DeRemer) all agree that West Leg Road is much better than the Alpine Trail.

Don't ski West Leg Road through the ski area. The last turn before the bottom of Jeff Flood is too flat and

slow, and you then have to ski against the traffic coming from the Kruser trail. Instead, ski the Kruser trail and then turn sharply right just before the narrow passage under the Jeff Flood lift. The sign there is hard to see.

2-Way Radios



On the mountain, use a 2-way radio to connect with us on channel **6-19**. That's channel 6, code 19. Just ask for any Mountain High members. If nobody answers, maybe they forgot to turn their radios on. Try again a half hour later.

But don't be surprised if there is no answer at all. For some reason, fewer of us carry a radio these days. People think that a cell phone is enough. But a cell phone doesn't always have a signal. Also, you cannot communicate with a whole group of people by phone.

A radio broadcasts your message to everyone in your group.

Some people may have bad memories of using 2-way radios some 10 - 20 years ago, when there was a lot of chatter from strangers on the radio. But there is no more chatter on the airwaves these days. It's just us.

Ribbons



We are still looking for the best way to identify our club members on the slopes. We might eventually print some flags with our club's

logo and affix them to our ski poles.

But for now, let's use a simple solution. Let's tie some orange ribbons to our ski poles. If you don't have any orange color, red or yellow will work too.

This is especially useful for our new club members. When you see someone with colorful ribbons tied to their ski poles, feel free to approach them and ask if they are members of the Mountain High Snowsport Club.

If you don't want to be approached by other members, don't tie a ribbon to your ski pole. If you do have one, it's an implied invitation to people to come ski with you.

When and Where to Find Us

In addition to the times listed below, our members ski at other times too. The 2 groups mentioned below are the most visible. We need to hear more from weekend skiers at Meadows and mid-week skiers at Timberline and Skibowl. Use our two Forums and our Facebook page to communicate with others.

Weekends at Timberline or Skibowl



Come ski with us! Just for fun. Can you show us some new trail, a secret stash, a hidden slope? Or can we show you something new you haven't skied before? Let's find out. Usually on Saturdays.

Please drive up early. The parking lots fill up by about 7:30 or 7:45 am, 1.5 hours before the lifts open. Crazy, but that's how it is. Drive up, park, and then snooze or have breakfast in the car.

There are no long lift lines at Timberline, even when the parking lots are full. That's because Timberline's lift capacity far exceeds their parking lot capacity.

Meet a few minutes before 9 am, all dressed up and ready to go skiing. **At Timberline**, meet near the slope-side day lodge exit, next to the free ski check.

At Skibowl, meet on the back side of the cafeteria building, not far from the bottom of the stairs.

Midweek at Mt. Hood Meadows



A group of us go skiing at Mt. Hood Meadows on week days, all winter, usually on Thursdays, or whenever there is good powder.

At Meadows, find us in the cafeteria in the South lodge

near the Schuss restaurant on the slope level, 2nd floor. If we are not allowed in the lodge, then meet **near the top of the steps, usually at a ski rack on the right** where we would rest our skis & just hang out around 8:15-8:30 am.



2022 FWSA Convention in Portland, Oregon



The 89th Annual Far West Ski Association Convention will be held **June 9-12, 2022**, in Portland Oregon, at the **Holiday Inn Portland - Columbia Riverfront**. NOTE: This is not a new location. The Holiday Inn is the former Red Lion. Just a name change.

Mark the dates and plan to show up. This is a great opportunity to experience a Far West Convention on our own turf. Here are just a few highlights:

1. Outdoor activities on Friday morning (golf, a Columbia Gorge tour).
2. A mini ski show on Friday evening, including a Silent Auction with great deals on ski trips and more.
3. Educational (ski related) seminars, Public relations meetings, and more.
4. Travel Expo on Saturday morning. Meet with ski industry representatives.

Note that we the locals can register in a variety of ways, including: the complete convention package that includes lodging and meals, or the package without lodging, or register for just some of the activities.

Also note that **Friday night's ski show and silent auction are free for all**. Just show up. Visit some of the ski areas' booths, an bid on some of their offerings (ski trips etc.) that can be had for amazingly low prices, especially if nobody bids against you.

Mt. High

Whitefish Mtn. Resort Trip



March 13 - 20, 2022. 4, 5, or 7 nights - by train, car, or plane.

Whitefish Mountain Resort offers 3000 acres of skiing on all sides of Big Mountain. It has 11 chair lifts (3 express quads). It has 2,353 vertical feet and 105 named runs plus vast amounts of bowl and tree skiing.

This will be a flexible, arrange your own transportation trip. Amtrak runs overnight from Portland or Vancouver to Whitefish and return. Current prices



start as low as \$79 per person each way reserved coach. There are a limited number of sleeper berths available. If you prefer to drive, it is a ten-hour drive, and you can stop to ski at other places along the way.

We will be staying at the **Kandahar Lodge**, a very nice on-mountain hotel with a Swiss or

Austrian feel. The lobby/great room has a huge fireplace, an award-winning restaurant open only for dinner, and a small separate bar. There is no elevator. All the rooms are on the 2nd and 3rd floors.

It has a free van that will take you where you want to go on the mountain (not into town, there's a free public snow bus for that). The van only runs during the day. At night it's less than a five-minute walk to the bars and restaurants in the upper village, or to catch the snow bus into town.

You can ski-in but would have to walk 50 yards across a parking lot to ski out to a lift. Or take the free van.

For those traveling by train:

- * You will spend 2 nights on the train. The first and the last. You can sleep in the reclining seats, but it is highly recommended to ask for a sleeper car.
- * The train leaves Portland at 4:45 pm the day before and travels through the night. You need to reserve a ticket for March 12.
- * Train arrives in Whitefish early in the morning (at 7:41 am), and you can go skiing right away, after leaving your luggage in Kandahar lodge.
- * The train leaves Whitefish late in the evening, at 8:56 pm. You can ski all day and still have time for dinner in town before boarding the train home.

Price includes:

Free European-style continental breakfast, après ski cookies, freshly made popcorn, hot chocolate, coffee, and tea. Heated boot rooms and ski rooms. Free Wi-Fi, laundry, 24-hour front desk, large outdoor jacuzzi, steam room, and fitness center. Massages are available by appointment. All rooms have at least a small refrigerator and microwave. Some rooms have small kitchens; those will be assigned on a first-come first-served basis.

We have reserved all rooms for 7 nights from March 13 - 20, 2022, but we will also be able to offer either 4- or 5-night stays.

Because we will receive the 7th night comped, 6-night pricing will be the same as 7-night. To make things manageable & simplify matching of roommates,

All 4-night and 5-night stays must begin on March 13.

We will do our best to match you with a roommate who wants the same nights as you, but you are ultimately responsible for finding a roommate who wants the same nights as you to fill your room.

51 people have signed up. Wait list has cleared.

\$420/person for 6 or 7 nights (we get the 7th night free)

\$350 for 5 nights

\$280 for 4 nights.

For fewer than 6 nights, everyone in the room would need to have the same arrival and departure dates.





Farewell to Jon Tullis



Jon Tullis, Timberline's Director of Public Affairs is retiring this June, 2022. Some of you may know him, while others might say they have never heard of him, but chances are you have all seen him on TV and heard his first name many times, whenever you decided to ski the trail named "**Uncle Jon's Band**" at Timberline. Yes, that trail is named after Jon Tullis.

Jon joined the Timberline staff in 1984, hired by Richard Kohnstamm himself. He worked in various positions, organizing banquets, staffing the front desk and the ticket office. Within two or three years, he was in charge of starting the **Ski Host** program. By the way, our club members Kurt Krueger and Emilio Trampuz both volunteered as ski hosts (Kurt a lot longer than Emilio).

Jon eventually became **Director of Public Affairs**, and as such was often interviewed on TV whenever there were any news related to Timberline.

Jon was always drawn to music. He participated in the Timberline Acoustic Music Series for 10 years, and later started the annual Mountain Music Festival, held every Labor Day in the historic amphitheater since 2012.


We'll miss you Uncle Jon.

The cost of lift tickets is skyrocketing. Just a few years ago, it was astonishing to see a few ski areas starting to charge over \$100 per ticket. Now, it seems that all the big ones are charging close to \$100 or more, and many are charging up to \$250 per day. People's salaries have not doubled in recent years. The cost of lift tickets jumps by \$5 or \$10 almost every year. This is not just keeping up with inflation (which is extremely low right now). It is mainly corporate greed.

Most of the largest ski areas are run by corporations, and many of the CEOs of these corporations don't even ski. They are just in it to make money.

Fortunately, there are still lots of **independent ski areas** that are owned and operated by skiers, not corporations. They are called independent ski areas because they don't depend on financiers and share-holders. They are run by families, by ski enthusiasts.

We need to support such ski areas, because they are fast becoming our only refuge from the rising cost of skiing.



Teton Gravity Research (TGR) in cooperation with the **Indy Pass** has made a short documentary about a dozen independent ski areas and the people who run them. The video is called "**In Pursuit of Soul**".

Best of all, this film is free, and you can watch it from your own home. No need to go to a theater for this one. It is part of what is called **TGR TV**. But, there is a concern that this documentary might not always be available. Maybe it's part of the current TV programming, but it might be replaced with other content. So, see it ASAP.

The video covers ski areas such as: **49 Degrees North (WA)**, **Brundage Mt. (ID)**, **Beaver Mt. (UT)**, **Lost Trail (MT)**, **Mission Ridge (WA)**, **Snow King (WY)**, and many more.

After seeing the video, **go and ski some of these places**, and many others. It's quite simple to find out which ski areas are independent. There are two ways:

1. They are independent if they are part of the **Indy Pass**, which includes about 80 such ski areas.
2. It is independent if you have never heard the name before. Check out all the 193 western ski areas listed on the **SKI AREAS** page, and if you see any names you don't recognize there, these are almost definitely independent ski areas.

Watch the video. It's a good one. It's moving. It's meaningful. It's soulful.





