#### Spring. What Spring?

Very unusual Spring. Almost no Spring at all. Within just a few days in the first half of May, the weather has jumped from stormy and wintry to a hot Summer, with temperatures in the 80s and 90s in Portland and in the 60s on Mt. Hood.

The Palmer chairlift, which normally opens mid-April has still not opened in mid-May. It was ready to open this past weekend, May 13-14, 2023, but it did not open because of high winds. Even the Magic Mile has been closed this weekend. Update: Palmer finally opened on Monday, May 15.

The snow level st Timberline has dropped rapidly from a high of about 182 inches to just 117 inches by May 15. That's a drop of 65" within just a tad over two weeks.

# Mt.High Trolley Trail NORTH bike ride - Milwaukie to Tilikum bridge 🔬



May 18 (Thursday). Meet at 9:30 am. Leave at 10 am sharp. <u>Trolley Trail NORTH map</u>. The tour is about 15 miles. Start & Finish Location: SE Park Ave. Parking Garage near

2704 SE Park Ave., Milwaukie, Oregon

Relatively flat ride, but not a race. From the Max Park and Ride to Tilikum bridge and back is about 15 miles via the Trolley Trail.

We will return to the Park and Ride via the same route except thaat we will ride along the opposite side of the Willamette River

## Mt. High Indy Pass & Our Trips



The Indy Pass has grown to well over 120 independent ski areas around the US, over 30 of them in the West. And it is continuing to grow.

Brundage Mountain has decided to drop out of all other passes and stay only on the Indy Pass.

Our club is planning to organize next season's ski trips to visit a number of Indy Pass ski areas, where skiing is free for 2 days at each of them.

Linda McGavin says: "I'll try to find something that includes both Mt. Hood Meadows passholders and the Indy Pass."

Many of us who have had the Indy Pass last season received a special discounted if we purchased next season's pass in March. So, many of us did.

The Indy Pass has been on sale throughout April and May for **\$319** (with some blackout dates) or **\$419** without blackout dates.

Mt. Hood Meadows Pass holders can buy the Indy Pass as an add-on for just **\$239**.

But sale has now paused, and you can now only get on a waiting list. Do so at: <u>buy your Indy Pass</u>.

## **Crystal Mt. News**

Crystal Mountain (Washington) has great plans for renovation and expansion.

The first on the list is building a new 25,000 square foot day lodge, which is already being built in order to be ready by the start of the next 2023/24 winter



season.

The new owner, Alterra Mountain Company (IKON Pass) is pouring about \$500 million dollars into this development.

Next on the agenda is building more slopeside lodging. Then adding more lifts and opening more terrain.

## Idaho Ski Safari to Less Well Known Places

So, what did Emilio do this past Winter? He went on two fairly long road trips, aka "ski safaris", each over a week long. One trip was to the far north of Canada, where he visited 7 ski areas. This was around Christmas. At the end of that trip, he managed to total his car during the final drive home, but survived the accident unscathed. He hasn't had time yet to process and organize all of his pictures and videos from that trip.



Later, in February, he went on a 10 or 11 day trip to ski all of the Idaho ski areas that he had not visited before. Why? Because he is on a mission to ski all the ski areas west of Denver - including both the U.S. and Canada. There are a total of approximately 240 ski areas in the West, so it's quite a lot of driving and skiing to accomplish this goal. But, hey, at least Idaho is now all done! And this trip is now fully documented in a fairly long but comprehensive video that you can find on YouTube, or in a series of short videos, documenting one ski area at a time.

These are ski areas that most people will never see. They are smaller than the big and famous ones, but they offer a lot, including: no crowds, no lift lines, very affordable prices sometimes 10 times cheaper than the big resorts (\$15 or \$20 lift tickets as compared to over \$200 tickets at the big resorts). Also, the cafeteria prices are often 3 or 4 times lower than at the big resorts. **One ski area was free. Another runs on donations!**
